WOMEN'S GOLF

On Monday and Tuesday at the Hermitage Golf Course in Old Hickory, Tennessee, the TranSouth Conference Golf Tournament was held. On the women's side, Trevecca Nazarene finished first, Lyon College finished second, and Freed-Hardeman finished third. Seven individuals were named to the All-Conference team, including the overall individual winner, Mindy Seigenthaler of Trevecca Nazarene. Also named to the list was Chelsea Gillian of Lyon, Adriane Barnett of Lyon, Anna Durham of Freed-Hardeman, Kristi Gearhart of Trevecca Nazarene, Noel Moffett of Trevecca Nazarene, and Sara Kate Hendrix of Freed-Hardeman.

Golf is in between NAIA rating weeks. In this week's NAIA Region XI rankings, Freed-Hardeman is ranked No. 5. In the NAIA national rankings, no women's golf team was listed in the polls. MEN'S GOLF

On Monday and Tuesday at the Hermitage Golf Course in Old Hickory, Tennessee, the TranSouth Conference Golf Tournament was held. On the men's side, Cumberland finished first, Martin Methodist finished second, and Union finished third. Freed-Hardeman, Trevecca Nazarene, and Lyon rounded out the fourth, fifth, and sixth spots. Seven individuals were named to the All-Conference Team. Including in this list was Barry Conaster of Cumberland, Shane Vinson of Cumberland, and Joey Morefield of Martin Methodist, each who finished the tournament in a three-way tie for first. Cumberland's Conaster won first overall in the tie breaker. Also on the All-Conference list was David King of Trevecca Nazarene, Drew Cain of Freed-Hardeman, Tyler Sells of Freed-Hardeman, and Tyler Tillman of Martin Methodist.

Golf is in between NAIA rating weeks. The NAIA Region XI rankings have Cumberland in the No. 4 spot and Union in the No. 5 position.
